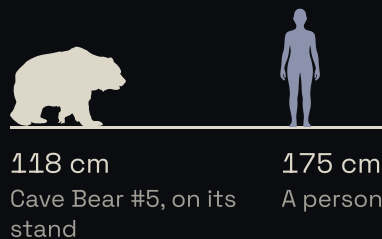

ABOUT THE SPECIES

A bear that slept more than it hunted.

Isotope studies of cave bear bone point to a diet that was mostly plants. The animals wintered deep in limestone caves of the Urals, and most of what survives comes from bears that never woke up — which is why complete individuals exist at all. The species disappeared about 24 000 years ago.

Legally excavated

Every specimen was recovered under permit in the Perm region and the Tyumen region of Russia and left the country with an export licence. Copies travel with the specimen.

Condition report

Each bone is listed: original, restored or replica. Replicas are used only where a part never fossilises — rhinoceros horns, for example — and are always declared.

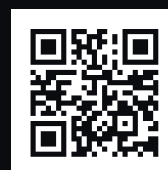
Delivery and installation
