ABOUT THE SPECIES

The largest cat of the Ice Age north.

About a tenth larger than a modern lion, with a longer, lower skull. Palaeolithic drawings show it without a mane. It hunted reindeer, horse and young mammoth across the mammoth steppe from the Urals to Alaska, and vanished with that landscape around 13 000 years ago.

Legally excavated

Every specimen was recovered under permit in the Perm region and the Tyumen region of Russia and left the country with an export licence. Copies travel with the specimen.

Condition report

Each bone is listed: original, restored or replica. Replicas are used only where a part never fossilises — rhinoceros horns, for example — and are always declared.

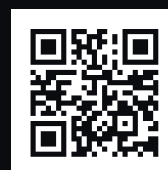
Delivery and installation
