ABOUT THE SPECIES

The animal the whole epoch is named after.

Woolly mammoths from the Irtysk basin are among the best-documented in the world: whole skeletons, tusks with growth rings that record each year of life, and — rarely — skin and hair preserved in frozen ground. Adults stood about three metres at the shoulder and lived to sixty. The last populations survived on Wrangel Island until about 4 000 years ago.

Legally excavated

Every specimen was recovered under permit in the Perm region and the Tyumen region of Russia and left the country with an export licence. Copies travel with the specimen.

Condition report

Each bone is listed: original, restored or replica. Replicas are used only where a part never fossilises — rhinoceros horns, for example — and are always declared.

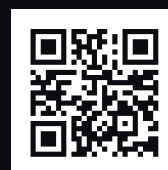
Delivery and installation
